August ?? A field trip will be held sometime during the month of August. Plans will be announced in the August DRIFTER.

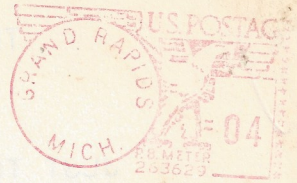
